Trinity CE Primary School Uniform

We want children at Trinity to wear their school uniform with pride. Our school uniform policy supports Trinity's high standards and ensures a strong sense of identity amongst our pupils. We ask that all parents, carers and children respect the school uniform policy.

All uniform should be labelled, either with a laundry marker pen or with an iron-on/sewn-in label.

All items marked with an asterisk* below are branded with the school logo and are available via the school uniform supplier (PMG Schoolwear). Items without an asterisk* can be purchased from any supplier. Alternatively, a second-hand uniform sale is run by FOTS once per term, as we strive for sustainability – further details below.

Jewellery

A watch suitable for school (no smart watches please) and plain stud earrings are permitted, but other items of jewellery are not a part of the school uniform and may prove hazardous in some

school activities. Earrings must be removed or taped over for PE & swimming. Please note: school does not take any responsibility for these items.

Hair

Long hair should always be tied back with smart, plain bands, clips or ribbons of school colours.

Coats

All pupils will need to bring an appropriate coat or raincoat to school at all times – we do allow children to play outside in light rain. A named sun-hat should be brought to school during warmer weather.

Bags

Reception, Year 1 & 2 should own a school book bag* which should be used for all books and letters. Years 3 - 6 may use the school book bag or a larger back-pack style bag. Packed lunches should be in a separate named lunch bag to avoid spillage onto school books and materials.

Ordering Your School Uniform & Second Uniform Sales

The main items of our school uniform are available via **PMG Schoolwear** and can be ordered either via phone 01494 529 693 or online at www.pmg-schoolwear.co.uk. Uniform is delivered to your home and can be pre-labelled with your child's name (please only do this if you are certain of sizes, as labelled items cannot be returned).

Each term FOTS holds a second-hand uniform sale. Items are competitively priced and profits get re-invested in projects that benefit all pupils. Please donate any un-wanted, clean items in the FOTS box which is directly outside the school office.

Personal Property

We cannot accept responsibility for the loss of personal property. Unless requested by the teacher, toys and money should not be brought to school.

If articles have names on them we can return them to the owner. Items of lost property are placed in the lost property box. During the last week of term, unclaimed items are displayed in the playground after school and then passed onto the FOTS Second Hand Uniform Sale committee.
