# Curriculum Newsletter Spring 2025



#### <u>English</u>

In English we are looking a the story the Snail and the Whale. In relation to this story the children will be writing postcards recounting parts of the story. They will then write a postcard independently writing about a place they have visited and what they are enjoying about the trip. They will be encouraged to use their sound knowledge to write words and use capital letters, figure spaces and full stops within their sentences.

### PE

In PE we will be looking at cooperation and problem solving. Working in pairs and part of a team to move a ball and other equipment from one place to another working with a partner or a team. Working together to problem solve, such as using two hoops to get from one side of the hall to another without stepping outside the hop. To work on their hand eye coordination to catch and throw a ball, bean bag to a partner or into a hoop.



#### <u>Maths</u>

To start the term, we are looking at 1 more and 1 less with numbers up to 5. We will practice this by looking at visual representations of 0-5, use number cards and introducing number lines. We will then move on to learn about mass and capacity. The children will have lots of opportunities to explore this topic in our continuous provision with different sized containers to transport things, water jugs to fill and materials such as sand and playdough. Towards the end of the spring term, we will move on to explore the numbers 6-10 in lots of depth. Children will have opportunities to practice doubling, combine two numbers together to make new ones

#### RE
